

In-kind Donation for Syrian Refugees –

Dear friends and colleagues,

Winter is coming again and this year the situation has worsened for the Syrian refugees and many of the children are at serious risk of freezing.

According to the UN, the Syrian refugees will out number 6 millions by the end of 2014.

It has been almost four years since the crisis started in Syria and the situation of the Syrian refugees has gone from bad to worse. But your generous and spontaneous responses in alleviating the suffering of the helpless and innocent children, women and elderly people have played a crucial role in giving them hope and a strong feeling that they are not forgotten and left alone.

The ongoing violence in Syria is taking a toll on children and their families. In-kind donations will help us meet some of the most urgent needs of the Syrian refugees living in and out camps.

The main purpose of these contributions is to provide refugees with winter attire, such as clothes and shoes, toys and school materials.

- 1) All kind of winter clothes (in good condition);
- 2) Shoes;
- 3) Sport shoes;
- 4) T-shirts;
- 5) Shorts;
- 6) Blankets;
- 7) Sleeping bags;
- 6) Others.

- 3) Pencils;
- 4) Rulers;
- 5) Erasers;
- 6) Pencil sharpeners;
- 7) Drawing books;
- 9) Others.
